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| Canberra Community Bicycle Network | Office of Transport - ACT Government | Canberra | Australian Capital Territory | \$545,454 | This project located in Canberra, ACT, will construct parts of the missing links in the Canberra Bicycle network, identified in the 'Ten Year Master Plan for Trunk Cycling and Walking Path Infrastructure 2004-14' compiled by the ACT Government Office of Transport. This project will involve the progressive construction of cycle paths along Ginninderra Drive, Cotter Road, Pearce/Chifley and Bowen Place cycle crossings. |
| Albury City Council | Thurgoona Drive Bike Path | Thurgoona | New South Wales | \$125,000 | This project, located in Thurgoona, NSW, will construct a 650m bike path along Thurgoona Drive and a bike bridge across Woolshed Creek, Albury, NSW. |
| Bankstown City Council | Henry Lawson Drive Bike Path | Bankstown | New South Wales | \$169,241 | This project located in Bankstown, NSW will extend and refurbish an existing section of bike path along Henry Lawson Drive, adjacent to the Georges River. The path will provide commuter access to Bankstown Airport and the associated industrial park as well as expanding the recreational bike network in accordance with the Bankstown Bike Plan. |
| Blacktown City Council | Construction of Mount Druitt to Oakhurst cycleway route | Blacktown | New South Wales | \$220,000 | This project, located in Blacktown, NSW will be a major North-South cycleway that links major transport (i.e. Westlink M7) corridors with major employment, recreational, education and other community facilities in the Blacktown Local Government Area. The project will involve the construction of a 2.5-3.0m wide concrete shared cycleway footpath, approximately 2.8km in length, from Bottles Road. |
| Boorowa Council | Boorowa Bike Path | Boorowa, NSW | New South Wales | \$532,821 | The project is located in the township of Boorowa, NSW and will construct 4,330 metres of cycleway to extend the current Boorowa bike path to encourage healthier lifestyles through increased recreational activities and provide employment opportunities. |
| Campbelltown City Council (NSW) | Campbelltown CBD Cycleway Improvements | Campbelltown | New South Wales | \$100,000 | This project located in Campbelltown, NSW, will construct new bicycle paths that link existing cycle paths directly into the City Centre, and construct better bicycle parking facilities within the city centre. |
| Campbelltown City Council (NSW) | Macquarie Fields Triathlon Cycleway Track | Macquarie Fields | New South Wales | \$250,000 | This project, located in Macquarie Fields, NSW, will construct a 1 km cycling track which will provide a linkage to the local swimming centre for triathlon competitions in the south western region of Sydney. The complex will also facilitate community cycle events and, when not used for competitions, the cycleway will be available to the general public for recreational purposes. |

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| Cobar Shire Council | Cycling Cobar - Lerida Road Bike Path | Cobar, NSW | New South Wales | \$69,750 | This project will construct a 2.4 kilometre off-road bicycle path servicing rural residential estates in Cobar, New South Wales. As Cobar does not have public transport, this path will provide a safe alternative to driving into town as well as providing an activity for visitors. |
| Coolamon Shire Council | The Coolamon Shire Walk, Ride and Play Infrastructure Project | Coolamon, Ganmain, Matong, Beckom, Ardlethan and Marrar | New South Wales | \$177,605 | This project, located in the Coolamon region, NSW, will construct bicycle/pedestrian pathways, and other recreational infrastructure, in Coolamon, Ganmain, Matong, Beckom, Ardlethan and Marrar. The pathways will complement existing pathways in these communities and improve community amenity, while at the same time encouraging activity and well-being among residents. |
| Council of the City of Botany Bay | Wentworth Avenue Kerb & Gutter and Shared Cycleway and Footway Construction | Mascot and Pagewood | New South Wales | \$454,000 | This project located in Mascot and Pagewood NSW will construct a shared pathway on the southern side of Wentworth Avenue between Sutherland Road, Mascot and Bay Street, Pagewood. The proposed pathway will be 3m wide and 1500m long. The pathway will link the western precinct and the eastern precinct of Botany Bay Council and provide a safe and direct route for commuters. |
| Council of the City of Sydney | Accelerated Cycleway Implementation | Alexandria, Rosebery, Zetland, Glebe and Forest Lodge | New South Wales | \$1,790,000 | This project in Alexandria, Rosebery, Zetland, Glebe and Forest Lodge, will fast-track implementation of a two-way on-road separated cyclepath network that will ultimately span 55 kilometres across the City of Sydney. |
| Council of the Municipality of Hunters Hill | Provision of Bike Paths within Hunters Hill | Hunters Hill | New South Wales | \$33,000 | This project, located in Hunters Hill, NSW, will construct and install bike routes to link the public transport nodes of Victoria Road and Woolwich Wharf, and in addition, to link these nodes to the Council's recreation reserves. |
| Council of the Municipality of Kiama | Jamberoo Valley Cycleway | North Kiama | New South Wales | \$183,938 | This project, located in North Kiama will construct a 2 kilometre bicycle path connecting Gainsborough residential estate in North Kiama to Swamp Road, near Jamberoo Village. National Bike Path Program funding will go towards stages 1 and 2 of a 3 stage project. |
| Griffith City Council | Griffith Lifestyle Project - Shared Pedestrian / Cycleway | Griffith | New South Wales | \$111,300 | This project located in Griffith, NSW will construct a shared pedestrian/cycleway linking three schools, the Griffith CBD and the Griffith Aquatic and Leisure Centre, creating a safer option to travel to and from school. The cycleway also provides access from Griffith High School to the TAFE. |
| Griffith City Council | Kidman Way Link - Shared Pedestrian / Cycleway | Griffith | New South Wales | \$111,750 | This project, located in Griffith, NSW, will provide an off road shared cycleway, pedestrian and disabled access path as an extension to an existing link. The link will connect the CBD of Griffith to the retail outlets, motels, cinema, clubs and sporting ovals south of the CBD and the residential areas to the west. |

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| Gunnedah Shire Council | Wandobah Cycleway Loop | Gunnedah | New South Wales | \$150,000 | This project, located in Gunnedah, NSW will construct a 2m wide cycleway along Wandobah Road, which runs through a housing commission area housing many young families. The cycleway will improve road safety and access to Wandobah Reserve, whilst promoting a healthy lifestyle. |
| Hay Shire Council | Hay Cycle Network | Hay | New South Wales | \$75,000 | This project, located in Hay NSW, will construct four new sections of the Hay Cycleway Network (a total of 735 metres). The bike-path network will eventually link South Hay with the Hay town centre and connect 3 schools, 5 museums, major sporting fields, the swimming pool and the library. |
| Inverell Shire Council | Inverell CBD to Lake Inverell Bike Path Program | Kyogle | New South Wales | \$200,191 | This project, located in Inverell, NSW, will involve the construction of a 2.9 km bike path to provide linkage from the busy CBD and river area of Inverell to the tranquil environment of Lake Inverell Reserve. The proposed bike path will be 2.4 m wide and pass through Albion Hill residential area with bike parking and rest facilities to be constructed at periodic locations along the path. |
| Liverpool City Council | Camden Valley Way/Hume Highway Cycleway. | Casula | New South Wales | \$113,636 | This project, located in the Casula region of Liverpool, New South Wales, will construct a 1.1 kilometres, 2.5 metre wide, paved off-road shared cycleway along Camden Valley Way and the Hume Highway, between Beech Rd and Leacocks Lane. |
| Liverpool City Council | Hoxton Park Road Cycleway | Liverpool | New South Wales | \$68,182 | This project, located in Liverpool, will construct a 650 metre paved off-road 2.5 metre wide shared cycleway along Hoxton Park Road between the Liverpool Bus Transit Way and the Liverpool CBD. |
| Liverpool City Council | Kurrajong Road Cycleway - Stage 1 | Casula | New South Wales | \$100,000 | This project, located in the Casula region of Liverpool, will construct and widen a current 1600 metre paved off-road footpath into a 2.5 metre wide cycleway along Kurrajong Road, between the Hume Highway and Cedar Road, Casula. |
| Liverpool City Council | Kurrajong Road Cycleway - Stage 2 | Liverpool | New South Wales | \$81,818 | This project, located in the Prestons region of Liverpool, will construct and widen a current 1300 metre paved off-road footpath into a 2.5 metre wide cycleway along Kurrajong Road, between Cedar Road and San Marino Drive. |
| Liverpool Plains Shire Council | Quirindi Bike Path | Quirindi | New South Wales | \$186,364 | This project located in Quirindi NSW, will construct a 1.5 kilometre by 1.5 metre wide cycleway along the bank of the Jacob and Joseph Creek which will create an alternative transport route for people wishing to access businesses in town. |
| Manly Council | Manly Bike Network Missing Links | Manly | New South Wales | \$325,000 | The project, located in Manly, NSW and will construct five bike-paths projects to fill in missing links in Manly's bike network: Balgowlah Heights on-road bike route; Seaforth North off-road bike path; Darley Road shared path; a shared path along Hill Street and Rosedale Avenue Fairlight; and a shared path along Balgowlah Road. |

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| Marrickville Council | Cook's River Regional Bicycle Route - Reconstruction and Widening | Marrickville | New South Wales | \$200,000 | This project, located in Marrickville, NSW, will involve the staged reconstruction and widening of existing substandard regional cycleway route to a modern cycleway standard to enhance its safety, geometry and capacity. |
| Parramatta City Council | Closing Parramatta Valley Region Cycleway's Missing Links (Sections 22-24) | Rydalmere | New South Wales | \$400,000 | This project located in Rydalmere, New South Wales, will construct 900 metres of cycleway to link two sectors of a popular regional cycleway network, improving cyclist safety. |
| Rockdale City Council | Cook Park Monterey - Cycleway Construction | Ramsgate and Monterey | New South Wales | \$135,000 | This project, located in Ramsgate and Monterey (Rockdale Area), NSW, will construct a 340m long and 3.5m wide section of dedicated cycleway in Cook Park which will become part of the Regional bay to bay cycleway. This Regional Cycleway links the Sydney Olympic Park at Homebush Bay with Botany Bay, a total cycleway length of 53km. |
| Ryde City Council | Epping Road Cycleway | Macquarie Park | New South Wales | \$116,200 | This project, located in Macquarie Park, NSW will construct a 270m by 3m bike path from Shrimpton's Creek to Lyon Park Road to complete a missing link of the Epping Road Regional Bike Route, and to encourage alternative forms of sustainable transport to access the Macquarie Park precinct. |
| Ryde City Council | Kissing Point Park Cycleway | Putney | New South Wales | \$99,700 | This project, located in Putney, NSW, will construct a 296 m by 1.9 m bike path from Teemer Street to Morrison Road to encourage alternative forms of sustainable transport to access the Macquarie Park precinct. |
| Ryde City Council | Morrison Bay Park Cycleway | Putney | New South Wales | \$87,700 | This project, located in Putney, NSW will construct a 3m by 296m long path through Morrison Bay Park to encourage alternative forms of sustainable transport to access the Macquarie Park precinct. |
| Shellharbour City Council | Elliott Lake Shared Use Path | Shellharbour | New South Wales | \$242,500 | The project is located at Shellharbour will complete the missing link of 3.2 kilometres between Lake Illawarra Beach in the north and Barrack Point to Shellharbour in the South. The project involves the construction of a concrete bridge over Elliott Lake and additional bike path construction to link the new bridge to the existing bike path on the north side of the lake. The completed bike path will run along 12 kilometres of coastline from the northern boundary of Shellharbour LGA at Central Park at Oak Flats, along Lake Illawarra to Shellharbour Village in the south. The project will provide additional seating along the route and new bike racks will be installed in the vicinity of Shellharbour Village. |
| Shoalhaven City Council | CBD Cycleway Project (Nowra & Ulladulla) | Nowra and Ulladulla | New South Wales | \$750,000 | This project, located in Nowra and Ulladulla will construct and upgrade cycle ways and footpaths within the CBD's of Nowra and Ulladulla. |
| Shoalhaven City Council | Cycleway along Shoalhaven River | Nowra | New South Wales | \$100,000 | This project, located in Nowra is for a 2m wide cycleway built along the top of a levee bank alongside the Southern banks of the Shoalhaven River. |

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| Sutherland Shire Council | Captain Cook Drive On-Road Cycle Facility | Kurnell | New South Wales | \$29,545 | This project is located in the Sydney suburb of Kurnell, NSW and involves the completion of a 'missing link' section off an on-road cycle path on the shoulder of Captain Cook Drive on what is a heavily utilised cycle route. |
| Sutherland Shire Council | Continuation of Regional off-road share pathway network - Oakwood St, Sutherland to Princes Highway, Kirrawee | Sutherland and Kirrawee | New South Wales | \$395,455 | The project is located in the Sydney suburbs of Sutherland and Kirrawee, NSW and provides for the continuation of an existing, regional, shared pathway network that will provide a new off-road pedestrian and cycle link from Sutherland west to Sutherland town centre, the Kirrawee industrial area and the Princes Highway at Kirrawee. |
| Tamworth Regional Council | Tamworth Regional Council Cycleways | Tamworth | New South Wales | \$135,000 | The project located in Tamworth, Manilla and Barraba in NSW will construct 13.5km of new cycleways within the Tamworth region for both commuters and recreational cyclists. |
| Upper Lachlan Shire Council | Completion of Shared Footway and Bike Path Laggan Road | Crookwell, NSW | New South Wales | \$26,000 | This project, located in Crookwell, NSW will complete a signed path linking the corner of Laggan and Saleyards Roads with the Main Street and the recreational centre of town, to create a vital link and safe pedestrian, motorised scooter and cyclist path. |
| Waverley Council | Completion of Waverley Bike Plan | Waverley | New South Wales | \$145,218 | This project located in Waverley, NSW, will complete the outstanding sections of the 1999 Waverley Bike Plan. This will further improve bicycle safety and connectivity for cyclists travelling to and from Bondi Beach and Bondi Junction surrounding shops, schools and residential areas. |
| Wingecarribee Shire Council | Illawarra Highway, Robertson Cycleway | Robertson | New South Wales | \$237,000 | The project, located in Robertson will construct a 685 metre long and 2.5 metre wide cycleway (shared path) along the southern side of the Illawarra Highway from Main Street to Fountaindale Road. |
| Wollondilly Shire Council | Share Cycleway Bridge Street, Thirlmere | Thirlmere | New South Wales | \$90,000 | This project located in Thirlmere, NSW, will construct a 1 km concrete shared cycleway on Bridge Street from Thirlmere towards Picton. |
| Wollongong City Council | Missing Links & Replacement Programme for Primary Cycleway Network | Wollongong | New South Wales | \$277,909 | This project, located in Wollongong will involve the construction of missing links and replacement of failed sections of the Primary Cycleway Network within Wollongong. |
| Darwin City Council | Connecting Darwin: Building New Cycle Linkages | Darwin | Northern Territory | \$1,054,545 | The project, located in Darwin, Northern Territory will deliver new bicycle paths and cycle path reconstruction and refurbishment, including signage and water bubblers along the main recreational bike path. The project also includes the installation of bike storage facilities and the development and implementation of a consolidated cycle path strategy. |

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| Katherine Town Council | Replacement of off-road bicycle paths | Katherine | Northern Territory | \$80,000 | This project located in Katherine, Northern Territory will replace 1.2 km of existing bitumen surfaced bicycle paths that will link Katherine East with the sportsgrounds, Aquatic Centre, Central Business District, Katherine North and South. The concrete bicycle path will provide a durable surface able to cope with wet swampy conditions during the wet season and will provide a safe passage for cyclists, walkers and joggers. |
| Cairns Regional Council | Cycling and Walking in Cairns Made Easy | Cairns | Queensland | \$697,000 | This project located in Cairns, Queensland, will construct new concrete off-road shared paths, on-road cycle lanes which will involve road-widening and line marking on existing roads, as well as bicycle parking facilities. |
| Cooktown Bikeway Ring | Cook Shire Council | Cooktown | Queensland | \$307,169 | The project located in Cooktown, Queensland, will construct a 'bikeway ring' approximately 1,680 metres long and 2 metres wide that will provide linkages to tourism points-of-interest, community facilities and essential services. |
| Dalby Regional Council | Sandalwood Avenue to Dalby Bikeway Project | Dalby | Queensland | \$207,864 | This project located in Dalby, Queensland will install approximately 2 km of concrete bikeway including the construction of a bikeway / pedestrian bridge over a waterway to allow all weather access to the Sandalwood Avenue area. |
| Goondiwindi Regional Council | Construction of new Bikeways in Goondiwindi | Goondiwindi | Queensland | \$163,500 | This project, located in Goondiwindi, Queensland, will continue to construct a 2m wide network of bikeways along Johnston Road (approx 650 metres), Lagoon Street (approx 410 metres) and Lamberth Road (approx 200 metres). |
| Southern Downs Regional Council | Southern Downs Walk / Bikeway Upgrades | Warwick, Allora, Killarney, Stanthorpe | Queensland | \$68,250 | This project located in Warwick, Allora, Killarney and Stanthorpe, Queensland, will pave existing unpaved paths, providing safe pedestrian and bike access in each location: Warwick (650 metres in length & 2 metres wide); Allora (180 metres in length & 1.5 metres wide); Killarney (310 metres in length & 2 metres wide); and Stanthorpe (220 metres in length & 1.5 metres wide). |
| Alexandrina Council | Angas River Shared Path, Strathalbyn, Stage 1 | Strathalbyn | South Australia | \$140,415 | The project, located in Strathalbyn, SA, will construct Stage 1 of a shared path extending from the northern to the southern township limits. The path is ideally located in the Angas River Valley that forms a linear reserve over the full length. |
| Alexandrina Council | Riverside Shared Path - Goolwa Stage 1 | Goolwa | South Australia | \$195,327 | This project in Goolwa, South Australia will construct a 3.3km shared off-road bicycle and pedestrian path from Laffin Point, Goolwa, along the foreshore to the Goolwa Wharf carpark (east of the Hindmarsh Island bridge). Pedestrians and cyclists can then travel across the bridge and link up with the newly-constructed Hindmarsh Island Bikeway. |

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| City of Mitcham | Hills-Plains Commuter/Recreation Path (Caroline Path) | Belair and Lynton | South Australia | \$610,100 | The project, located in Belair & Lynton, South Australia, will construct a 1,625m bikepath linking Caroline Ave, Belair to Beagle Terrace, Lynton, and provide a safe, all weather, hard-surface bike path that links the Mitcham Hills to the Mitcham Plains. |
| City of Port Lincoln | Council Reserve Shared Pathway and Cycle and Pedestrian Refuge | Port Lincoln | South Australia | \$40,909 | This project, located in Port Lincoln SA, will construct a 2.5 m wide shared path through the Council Reserve from Normandy Place to the Flinders Highway. The project will also construct a bicycle/pedestrian refuge at the intersection of the Flinders and Lincoln Highways. |
| City of Unley | City of Unley Bike Pathways and Commuter Project | Unley | South Australia | \$359,750 | This project, located in Unley SA, will construct pathways and erect lighting along the old Glenelg to City tramline. The pathway will: separate cyclists and vehicles from South Road to the West Unley Commuter Route; provide an on-road bicycle lane from the Commuter Route to Greenhill Road; and provide bicycle racks throughout the city. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on East Avenue | Adelaide | South Australia | \$35,500 | This project, located in Allenby Gardens, Adelaide, South Australia will install a bicycle lane on East Avenue (Port Road - Grange Road) and improve cyclist safety. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane installation on Glynburn Road | Glynde | South Australia | \$21,000 | The project located in Glynde, SA, will construct a bicycle lane on Glynburn Road between Lower North East Road and Magill Road. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Grange Road | Kidman Park | South Australia | \$21,500 | The project located in Kidman Park, SA, will construct a bicycle lane on Grange Road, a western suburbs arterial road, between Crittenden Road and Tapleys Hill Road. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane installation on Henley Beach Road | Lockleys | South Australia | \$75,000 | This project in Lockleys, South Australia, will widen an arterial road to install a bicycle lane, increasing safety for cyclists on a popular route from the western suburbs into the city. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Holbrooks Road | Flinders Park | South Australia | \$17,500 | This project, located in Flinders Park, Adelaide, South Australia will install a bicycle lane on Holbrooks Road between Grange Road and Henley Beach Road, which will improve the safety conditions for cyclists using this route. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Lady Gowrie Drive | Taperoo | South Australia | \$75,000 | This project, located in Taperoo, South Australia, will install a bicycle lane on Lady Gowrie Drive, a north-western suburbs arterial road. There is a strong demand by cyclists using this road as it runs between Adelaide's CBD and port. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Majors Road | O'Halloran Hill | South Australia | \$158,000 | The project, located in O'Halloran Hill, SA, will construct a bicycle lane on Majors Road by sealing the shoulders of this arterial road. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Montacute Road | Newton | South Australia | \$25,000 | The project, located in Newton, SA, is to install a bicycle lane on Montacute Road between Glynburn Road and Stradbroke Road and improve cyclist safety. |

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| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Port Road (II) | Cheltenham | South Australia | \$30,000 | This project, located in Cheltenham, South Australia, will install bicycle lane on Port Road from Cheltenham parade to Grand Junction Road, which would represent a significant safety improvement for cyclists. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Portrush Road | Evandale | South Australia | \$18,000 | This project, located in Evandale, SA, will install a bicycle lane on Portrush Road which joins Adelaide's pre-eminent cycling track (Linear Park) to residential streets. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane Installation on Richmond Road | Richmond | South Australia | \$20,500 | The project located in Richmond, SA, will construct a bicycle lane on Richmond Road, a western suburbs arterial road, between Marion Road and South Road. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane on Bower Road | Ethelton | South Australia | \$11,750 | The project, located in Ethelton, SA, will install a bicycle lane on Bower Road between Grand Junction Road and Causeway Road in the western suburbs of Adelaide. There is a strong incentive for cyclists to use this road as it crosses the Port River linking residential streets either side of the river and with the local shopping centre. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane on Churchill Road | Dudley Park | South Australia | \$24,090 | The project located in Dudley Park, SA, will install a bicycle lane on Churchill Road, a north-western suburbs arterial road, between Torrens Road and Regency Road. There is a strong incentive for cyclists to use this road as it runs north-south at the edge of Adelaide's CBD taking commuting cyclists between their residences and their workplaces. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane on Diagonal Road (I) | Warradale | South Australia | \$20,000 | The project located in Warradale, SA, is to install a bicycle lane on Diagonal Road, between Brighton Road and Prunus Street. This will construct Stage 1 of a cycling lane that will form the backbone of the cycling network that allows local residents to replace vehicular trips to the Marion Shopping Centre. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane on Diagonal Road (II) | Oaklands Park | South Australia | \$20,000 | The project located in Oaklands Park, SA, is to install a bicycle lane on Diagonal Road, a south-western suburbs arterial road. This cycling lane will form the backbone of the cycling network that allows local residents to replace vehicular trips to the Marion Shopping Centre. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane on Grand Junction Road | Northfield | South Australia | \$27,500 | The project located in Northfield, SA, will construct a bicycle lane on Grand Junction Road, a western suburbs arterial road, between Briens Road and North East Road. |
| Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure | Bicycle Lane on Manton Street | Hindmarsh | South Australia | \$10,500 | The project located in Hindmarsh, South Australia, is to install a bicycle lane on Manton Street, a western suburbs arterial road that leads to the Hindmarsh Football Stadium, from South Road to Adam Street. |
