

myki valid on trams and buses

From Sunday 25 July 2010, myki will be valid for travel on Melbourne's trains, trams and buses in Zones 1+2, as well as selected regional bus services in Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo, Seymour and the Latrobe Valley including Warragul.

Where can myki be used?

From Sunday 25 July, myki will be valid for travel on Melbourne's trains, trams, and buses in Zones 1+2 and buses in Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo, Seymour and the Latrobe Valley including Warragul. myki can also be used on all SMART bus and Nightrider services, but is not yet valid on Skybus, Sunbus or Avalon Airport Shuttle services.

Where can a myki be purchased?

Currently, myki can be purchased from:

- myki.com.au
- myki call centre 13 6954 (13 myki)
- myki centre at Southern Cross Station
- myki window at Flinders Street Station
- The MetShop
- Retail outlets in regional centres where myki is operating.

How much does a myki cost?

A full fare myki costs \$10 and a concession myki \$7.

Where can myki be topped up?

- **myki machines across Melbourne** (Metro train stations, selected tram stops and bus interchanges)
- **call centre** 13 6954 (13 myki)
- **myki.com.au**
- **Auto Top Up** (myki money only)
- **On board a regional bus** (cash only)

The rollout of myki in Melbourne continues. In the next stages customers will be able to purchase and top up myki at more locations throughout Melbourne.

Public transport users can choose between myki or Metcard to pay their fare.
